- Teachers who hardly (ever) speak English?

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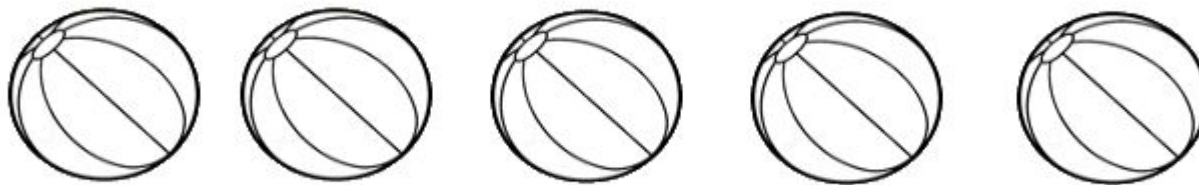

No teaching!

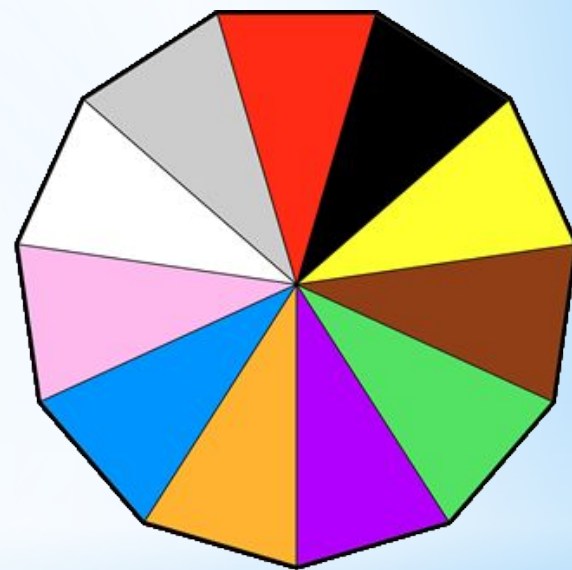
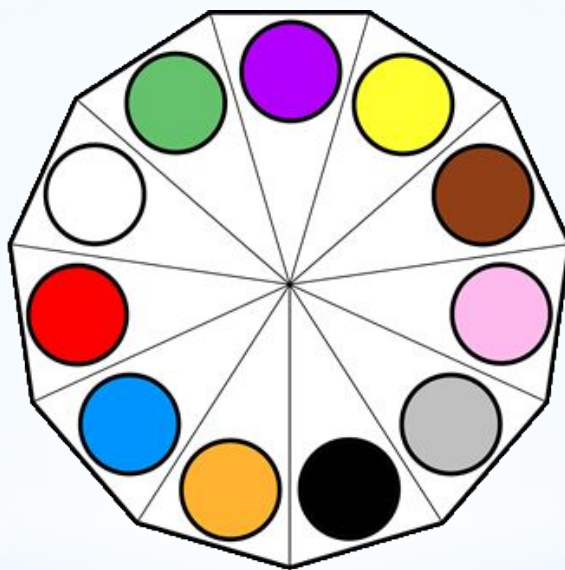
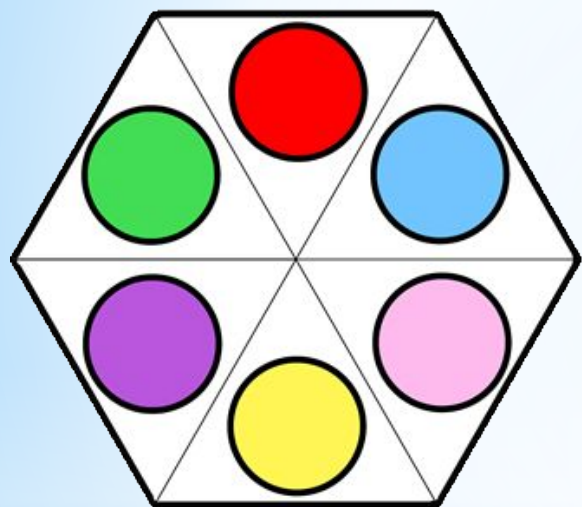
Children acquire the language through the moments they live, they enjoy the process and show progress





















They use the new language intuitively, spontaneously!

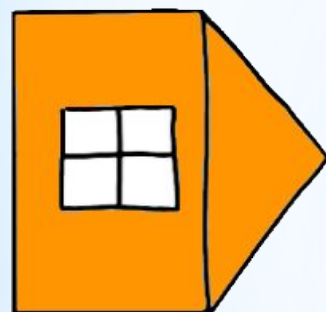
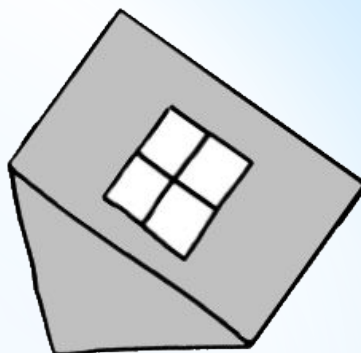
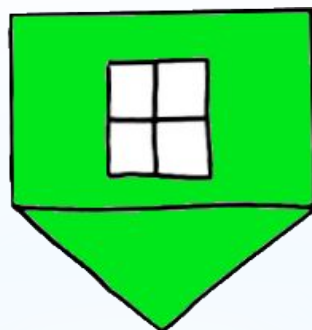
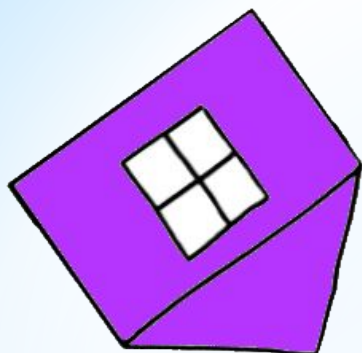

Goodbye Song



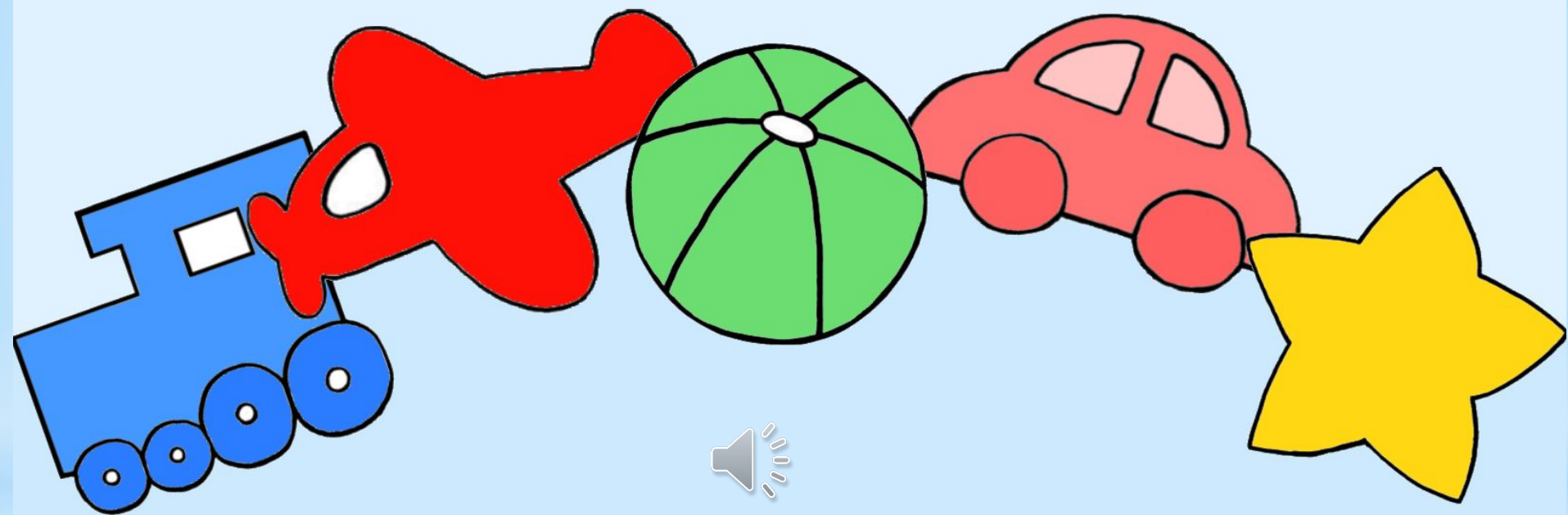

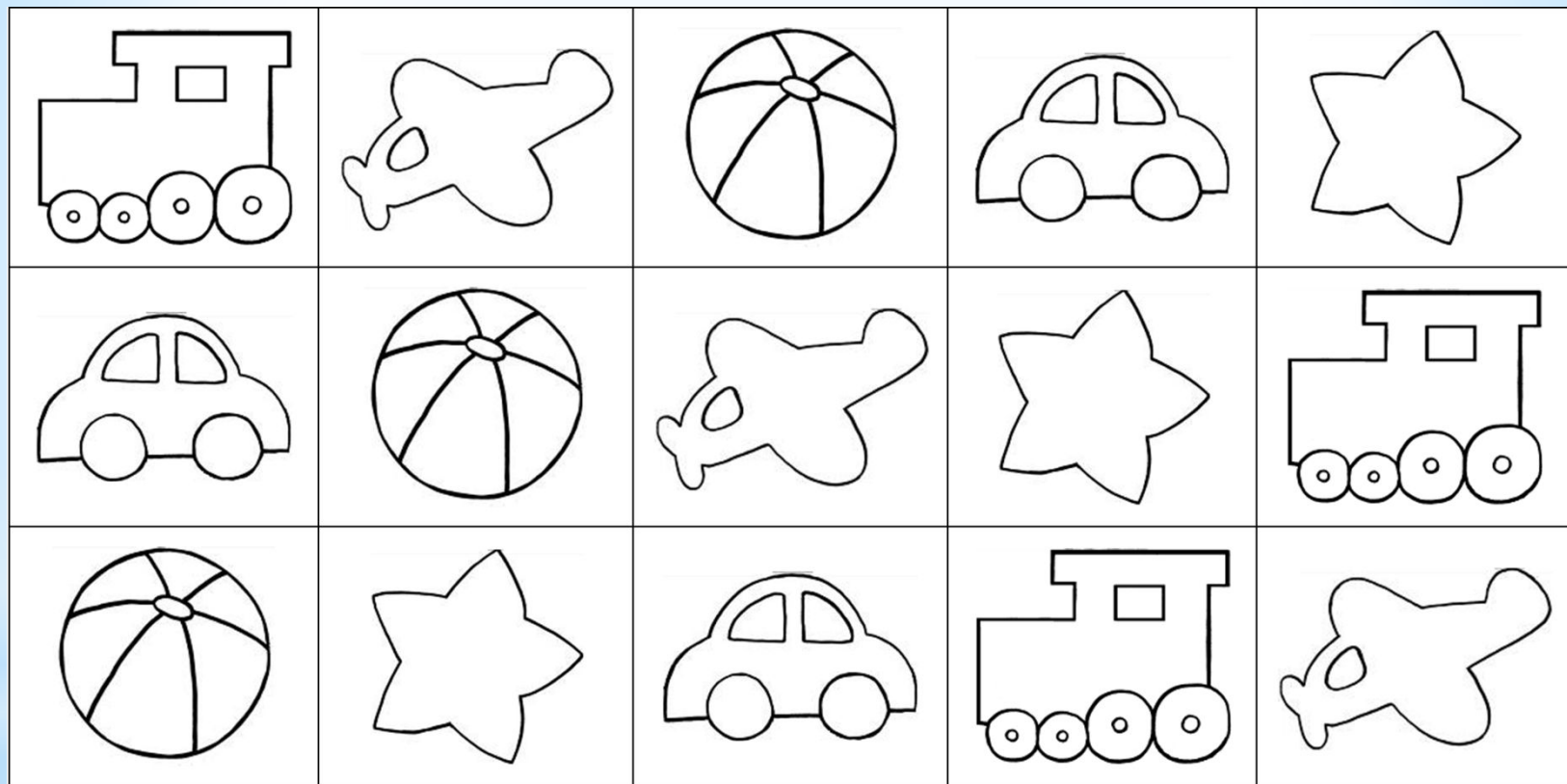
How to Make a Paper Hat

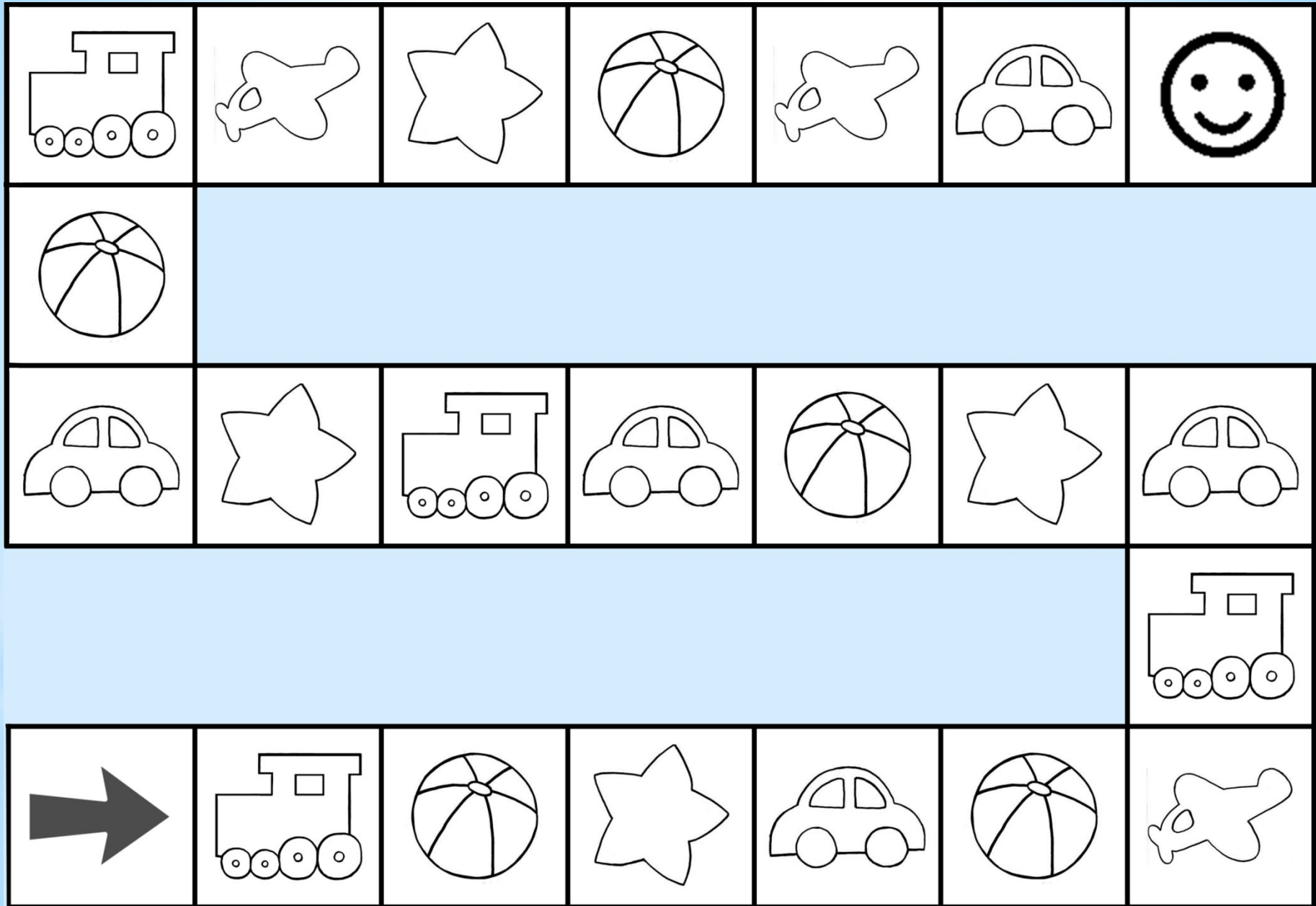
One, two, three, look at that.

Lift up the flaps, that's my advice.

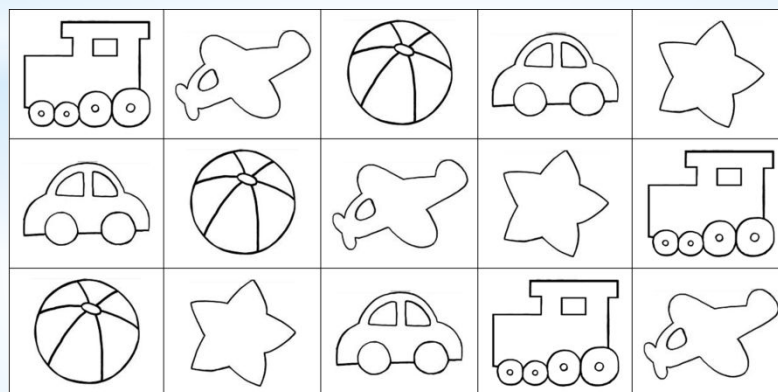
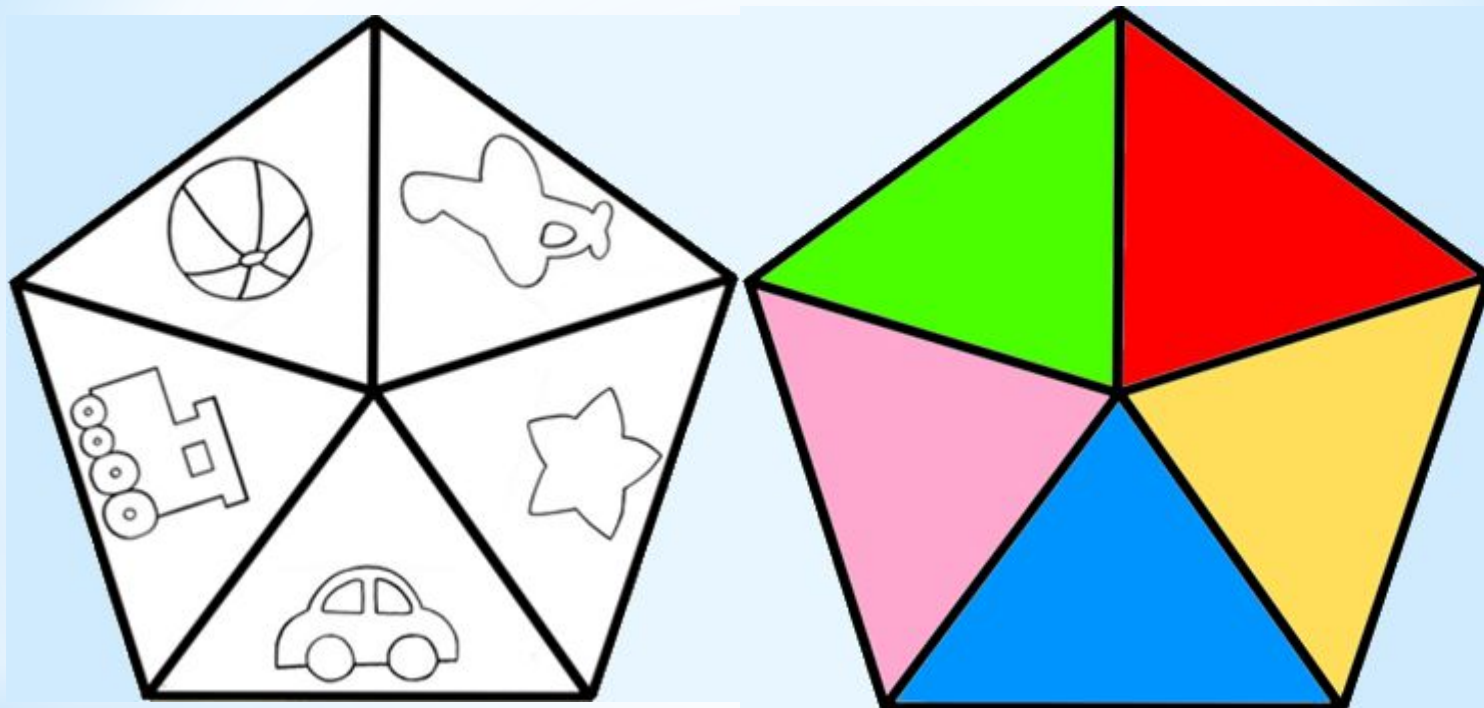
How to Make a Mini Book
