Implementation

Advantages

- Promotes risk-taking & learner autonomy
- Personalises content
- Multiple learner styles
- “Real-life” English
- Easy to incorporate online
- Project-based lessons

Disadvantages

- Privacy - GDPR
- Limited use by students
- Limited scope
- Spamming
- Time-consuming - create, curate & adapt material
- Inaccuracies
